Brief Guide to the Hannon-Phalen Family

Henry Hannon (1830-1914) immigrated to the United States from Ireland in 1848, living first in Peru, Illinois, and then moving to Ivesdale, Illinois, in 1860. He built the first grain elevator in Ivesdale in 1865. Over time he expanded his grain business, established a lumber yard, and also sold salt and coal. He served as Mayor and on the Ivesdale Town Board in the 1870s and 1880s.

Michael Hannon (1853-1936), the son of Henry Hannon, was born in Peru, Illinois. He moved to Ivesdale with his father in 1860, and lived in that vicinity for the rest of his life. He worked in his father's businesses, and he took over the grain elevator when Henry retired. Michael sold the grain business to the Ivesdale Co-op Grain Company in 1904, and he then became the grain business manager for the Co-op. Like his father, he served as Mayor and on the Ivesdale Town Board.

Michael Hannon married **Elizabeth ("Lilly" or "Lillie") Murphy Hannon (1857-1955)** in 1888. Elizabeth was born in Peru, Illinois, and moved to Ivesdale in 1862. She and Michael had six children -- five sons and one daughter. She lived to the age of 98.

Roy Joseph Hannon (1898-1979), the fourth son of Michael and Elizabeth Hannon, was born in Ivesdale. He attended Brown's Business College in Decatur, Illinois, and worked for Loose-Wiles Biscuit Company as a traveling auditor. He enlisted in the Air Force during World War I and in the Army during World War II, although he was never posted overseas in either war. He never married. He returned to Ivesdale and lived with his mother during her later years.

Walter Leo Hannon (1900-1987), the youngest son of Michael and Elizabeth Hannon, was born in Ivesdale. He taught at the Ray School and Ivesdale Elementary, and took over as manager for the Ivesdale Co-op Grain Company after his father retired in 1935. Walter was manager for 31 years, retiring in 1966.

Michael Phalen (1866-1927) was born in Penn Yan, New York, and was the son of an Irish immigrant. His family moved to Piatt County, Illinois, in 1867. He managed livestock for the Allerton family in Allerton, Illinois. He farmed and raised cattle for himself as well. He married Ellen Elizabeth ("Lil") Sherlock in 1888. His daughter, Kathleen Phalen, married Walter Hannon in 1932.

Kathleen Phalen Hannon (1907-1989), daughter of Michael and Ellen Elizabeth Phalen, graduated from Normal Teachers College in 1926, and taught grade school until her marriage to Walter Hannon in 1932. She returned to teaching later, working at several public and Catholic schools in Champaign and around the county.

Ellen Cecelia Phalen (1909-2002) was the youngest child of Michael and Ellen Elizabeth Phalen. She was the aunt of Bruce Hannon.

Bruce Hannon (1934-) is Professor Emeritus of Geography & Geographic Information Science at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He initially donated this collection to the Library in 1992-1993, and has made additional donations to the collection since then.
